

Rules of entry

The Best of British Industry Awards

Terms and Conditions

1. Applications will only be accepted online via the official Awards website www.britishindustryawards.co.uk
2. The term 'Industry' refers primarily to commercial activities covering extraction, manufacturing, processing, construction, engineering, utilities, related trades, and companies that supply specifically to such industries. An 'industry' involves a physical, material transformation occurring (excluding specialist supply organisations). 3. The term 'British' refers to a company's headquarters being located in the UK
4. The Awards organisers, their partners, sponsors, suppliers to the Awards, and any wholly owned subsidiaries of the above are excluded from entering.
5. By accepting their entry, The Work Foundation, AMEC and the Sunday Times are not implying endorsement of companies or their products/services.
6. Applicants must be authorised to enter their organisation into the Awards programme.
7. It is the responsibility of the applicant to provide the relevant information for their entry, which will become the property of The Best of British Industry Awards committee and will not be returned.
8. The organisers reserve the right to audit any or all information supplied by an entrant and each entrant agrees to assist the organisers in any such audit in every way possible.
9. For any applicant knowingly providing false information on their application the organisers reserve the right to withdraw any award to that organisation, to publicise the withdrawal, and present the award to another applicant.
10. The short-listed awards candidates will be contacted by telephone and also published on the website on 27th October 2006.
11. Entry does not grant an organisation rights to use awards name, logo or images without the express written approval of the Best of British Industry Awards committee . Some winners may be granted permission to use an Awards logo for a limited period to promote their achievement. The Awards name, logo, and images are copyright of the Best of British Industry Awards committee .
12. Entries must be in English and received by 5 pm 13th October 2006.
